## **CHAMPIONS HOUSE REPORT #201**

Samuel has been resolving all the issues that arose at home while he was visiting the United States. We both knew that it would be difficult for him on his return and difficult it has been. He is being relentlessly harassed by the upper caste and so have I by an onslaught of phony emails. God is slowly working it all out. In India there is no set law. Money buys the court system in India so there is no justice for the poor either and especially "untouchable" Christians. I am very disheartened over the way higher caste "so called" Christians have been treating him out of jealousy, all because he visited us.

Nevertheless, Samuel perseveres for the ministry and we are just about ready to begin drilling new safe drinking water wells in 10 very remote tribal jungle villages. The well contractor complained and said that it is much further travel to these locations than the government would ever consider. That makes this project all the more appealing as far as we are concerned. We intend to reach the unreached. He wanted more money but Samuel told him "no." Photos of the villages are posted on FaceBook. Many of the village elders requested electric pumps but Samuel is going to provide a traditional hand pump system in each village instead. I asked him about that and he responded that they do not have the resources or the electricity required to install a power system, so he is installing a traditional hand pump.

I also had an idea about a new project last week. There are lots of widows that cannot feed their children or feed themselves and providing them with a basic sewing machine would give them a source of income even if they used sewing as barter for food. It would be a small investment that could change a family's life. I'm not certain where this thought came from. But now I know why.



We delivered a wheelchair to the "tiny girl" that we had found a few weeks back. She is so small that I told Samuel to purchase a traditional chair with a vinyl seat. She is actually 6 years old and stands less than 3' tall. She is very weak from malnutrition and is afflicted with polio on top of all her problems. She probably won't live a very long life. Samuel said that her parents were truly kind and loving Christians and were very grateful for this gift. They treated him with great honor. Noticing their pitiful home he asked them how they were possibly surviving. You can see it in the background of the photo. It is basically a 10 foot dirt floor hut.

Her father works long days of hard labor in the fields working for a wealthy landowner. All planting, weeding, cultivating and harvesting is done by hand in that region of the world. Her mother cannot work as she is needed at home to care for her child.

They have very few belongings. They are all three literally starving to death he told me. They survive on pure faith in God never knowing if they will eat the following day. I wonder how most of us would hold up in that situation?

My very first thought was probably the same one you are having right now. That wheelchair is way too large for her tiny body. I did not realize that she was that small. When I heard their story I immediately told Samuel to bring them a large supply of food ASAP. And add a blanket with 2 pillows so the child would sit comfortably in that chair. Linda thinks maybe a baby stroller would be more appropriate so I will check if they make them in India. I can't say I have ever seen one there.

I had just begun to tell him to purchase a sewing machine for the mother so she could also help provide an income for her family when before I could utter the words Samuel interrupted and said that she also mentioned that she had training on a sewing machine. Then it all fell together as if it were meant to be. I knew then why I had that thought about sewing machines a few days earlier. There is so much joy serving a hopeless Christian family like this. Your gifts have changed the lives of this family.




Samuel and I are back in sync. Typically his thoughts are my thoughts and everything seems to flow like this project did. I will post the photos when he delivers those new items. He is also presenting a paralyzed 9 year old little girl with a new wheelchair. Her story is a variation from the norm and very sad too. She does not have polio or a birth defect. She had a tumor when she was 2 years old and she has been paralyzed ever since the hospital removed it.
